# Celebrating 18 Years of Meals of Hope

As we mark our 18th year, we reflect on our humble beginnings, notable achievements, and future plans.

The idea for Meals of Hope was born when my family witnessed children in a poor Haitian school were starving and couldn't learn. Inspired by a meal packing program in the Midwest, we launched our first event in August 2007, with the support of the Rotary Club of Naples. That day, 500 volunteers packed over 135,000 meals, which we donated to Haiti and the Harry Chapin Food Bank. With the success of this event, we set a goal to feed people in SWFL and packed 1 million meals in our first year.

Over time, we improved our meals—adding soy protein, 21 vitamins and minerals, and expanding meal options. In 2012, we purchased a 15,000 sq. ft. warehouse in North Naples. Recognizing limited local food distribution, we launched three mobile food pantries in 2014. Hurricane Irma in 2017 was a turning point, prompting us to distribute food at 45 locations and over 2 million pounds of food that year. We transitioned from primarily meal packing to becoming a major food pantry provider.

Today, we're Florida's largest food pantry operator, with 14 locations in Collier and Lee Counties, distributing frozen meat, fresh produce, canned and dry goods, and baby items to about 4,000 families weekly. We continue to pack eight varieties of dried, fortified meals nationwide, with most meals staying in the communities where they are packed with the revenue generated coming back to assist our local food pantry operations.

Since inception, our volunteers have packed over 115 million meals. Our packing events provide significant volunteer opportunities that teach the importance of giving back. This

year alone, close to 80,000 volunteer hours will be logged throughout the Country. We also partner with agencies like Feeding Dreams, distributing over 100,000 weekend backpacks to food-insecure elementary students across Collier, Lee and Palm Beach counties each school year. Recognizing the lack of baby food distributed at our food pantries, we initiated three local baby food pantries.

We've taken a bold step forward to support the rising need for food assistance in Collier and Lee Counties by making a transformative investment in our future. Recently we purchased an 18,000 sq ft warehouse off Mercantile Avenue in Naples, with more than 9,000 sq ft of cooler and freezer space. This allows us to buy in bulk, supporting both our pantries and other local food programs, especially in times of food shortages.

As we approach our 20th anniversary, we're launching our first Capital Campaign, aiming to raise \$4.5 million over four years. Our most recent audit shows 93% of expenses go directly to hunger programs, reflecting our commitment to responsible stewardship. With your support, we can continue to serve Southwest Florida's food-insecure residents and ensure no one goes to bed hungry.



## **The Case for Support**





# Meals of Hope Works to FEED OUR Neighbors



## **Expanding Support Where It's Needed Most**

**Meals of Hope is more than a pantry.** We are a hub for hunger relief, helping families directly while supplying and supporting other organizations that serve our neighbors in need. Every program we operate multiplies impact, lifting up families and strengthening the entire regional food network.

#### **★** Mobile and Choice Pantries

14 locations across Collier and Lee Counties provide fresh produce, frozen meats, dry goods, and essential supplies to 4,000 families every week.

#### **★** Baby Pantries

3 locations supply formula, diapers, and healthy snacks for our youngest neighbors, helping parents bridge the gap when budgets fall short.

#### **★** Weekend Backpacks

Over 130,000 backpacks distributed during the school year ensure children have food when school meals aren't available.

#### **★** Meal Packing Events

Volunteers pack millions of nutritious meals that stay in their communities and keep our pantry shelves full.

### **Building Capacity for Greater Impact**

Meals of Hope has made a decisive move to secure the future of hunger relief in Southwest Florida. The purchase of an 18,000 sq. ft. facility with 9,000 sq. ft. of cold storage, one of the largest among food pantry operators in the country, allows us to scale our operations and meet growing demand.

#### What This Space Makes Possible

#### **★** Storage Expansion

Increased cold storage pallets capacity from 59 to over 300, ensuring stable food supply.

#### \* Regional Food Hub

Ability to buy in bulk and share resources with other local food pantries.

#### **★** Operational Efficiency

Multi-bay loading docks improve delivery and distribution speed.
